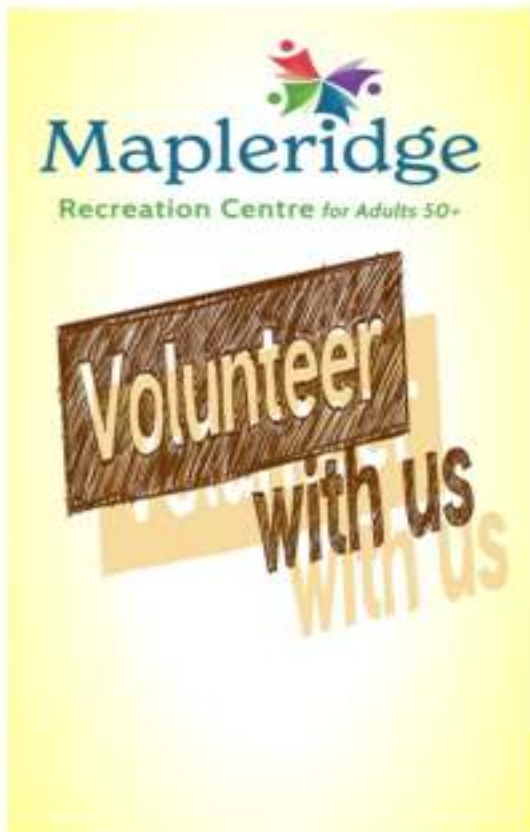

This is an important and ongoing fundraiser for Mapleridge Recreation Centre. Born April 8, 1955 is a Pulitzer Prize-winning American novelist, essayist, and poet. Her work often focuses on topics such as social justice, biodiversity, and the interaction between humans and their communities and environments.

Kingsolver has received numerous awards, and became the first author to win the Women's Prize for Fiction twice. Since 1993, each one of her book titles have been on the *New York Times* Best Seller list.

Kingsolver was raised in rural Kentucky, lived briefly in the Congo in her early childhood, and she currently lives in Appalachia. Kingsolver earned degrees in biology, ecology, and evolutionary biology at DePauw University and the University of Arizona, and worked as a freelance writer before she began writing novels. In 2000, the politically progressive Kingsolver established the Bellwether Prize to support "literature of social change".

Demon Copperhead by Barbara Kingsolver

Demon Copperhead by Barbara Kingsolver tells the story of a young man navigating a difficult life in Appalachia. The narrative follows his struggles with poverty, addiction, and the loss of loved ones, while also highlighting his relationships, artistic talent, and journey toward self-discovery. The book explores themes of resilience, community, and the impact of historical inequalities. The main character's relationships with his friends and mentors provide crucial support as he tries to break free from the destructive cycles of his past. The narrative also showcases his artistic growth as he uses his unique voice to reclaim his narrative.
